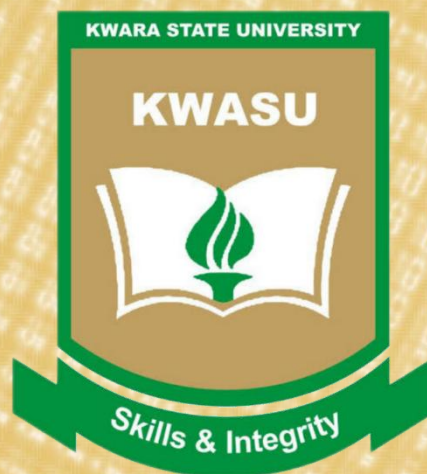

Guidelines for Authors

- i. MAJAF only welcomes original paper that has neither been submitted for consideration nor published elsewhere
- ii. Contributions should be written in English Language with abstract of 150-250 words.
- iii. The article should be in 1.5 line spacing with the option of ‘a space before and after 0”, Times New Roman font type, 12 font size, fully justified text
- iv. The latest American Psychological Association (APA) referencing style is acceptable.
- v. The manuscript should contain the title of the paper, names of the author(s), institutional affiliation, telephone number and e-mail address of the corresponding author
- vi. The manuscript should be structured in the order of:
 - Title
 - Abstract
 - Introduction
 - Literature Review
 - Methodology
 - Results and Discussions
 - Conclusion and Recommendation(s)
 - Reference

- vii. Keywords are to be written after the abstract as well as the appropriate JEL classification codes
- viii. Manuscripts should not exceed 15 pages in length including the references and annexes
- ix. Each manuscript should be accompanied with a non-refundable assessment fee of Six Thousand Naira Only (₦7,000)
